Description

The proposed solution is to increase the amount of biodegradable waste managed at the place of its production. To this end, municipalities are distributing free composters for use in their own gardens to all interested homeowners who produce green waste. People using household composters are exempted from some fees for municipal waste management. This solution will reduce costs related to waste disposal and management.

Objective

The proposed solution is primarily aimed at increasing the amount of biodegradable waste subject to recovery, and thus reducing the amount of waste sent to municipal landfills. In addition, it also aims to promote the residents' ecological attitudes regarding the proper management of biodegradable waste, including green waste, and to promote waste composting for their own needs.
